As this calendar year comes to a close, I wanted to take a little bit of Messenger space to reflect on all of the incredible ways God has worked in the lives of students and myself this last year. 2019 was a year of many great joys in Abide, as we saw many students come to church for the first time, know Jesus as their personal Lord and Savior for the first time, go to camp for the first time, try good coffee for the first time (I'm looking at you Starbucks) at tasty Tuesday, invite their friends, learn to praise the Lord in song, participate in Youth Sunday, lead a Discipleship group with Jr. Highers, and so much more.

God is moving in the lives of teenagers in this very community and everywhere I looked this year it was obvious that He was laying claim to this generation and this youth group. Over the course of the year, we (the Abide staff) met more than 30 new students through the outreach of our students to their friends. Praise the Lord!

The students of Abide made me really proud this year too, from the way they looked for opportunities to serve their families, friends, their youth group, and the strangers around them to their willingness to be honest, real, and vulnerable in a culture and community which often tells them to always put up an image of strength, success, and achievement has been beautiful and exemplary.

A specific example: toward the end of a teaching series we did in the Fall of 2019 about what it means to be "Here, Real, and Bold" (our slogan), one of our 7th grade girls' mother emailed me to share that the girl and her friend were so inspired to be bold that they began inviting a girl who sits alone at lunch and is often an outcast because of her learning disabilities to each lunch with their friends. How amazing is that! Each of our students holds such a specific, unique in the Abide family, and it's so cool to watch them grow into their roles and places within our group.

Time and time again in Scripture we see that God is a God of abundance, that He pours out so much more grace and mercy than we could ever need or deserve on our lives. I see that grace in mercy in my life in that I get to spend every day in the company of our Jr. High and High Schoolers. Listening to them as they tell me about their lives, playing games, singing songs, celebrating with them in their successes, truly feeling the depth of their losses, answering questions, and hearing the brilliant Holy Spirit led wisdom that they have are all some of the most incredible instances of God's mercy in my life, and I'm so thankful for every student who is a part of Abide and every student who will be some day.

Thank you, Jesus, for the many blessings you pour out on this church!

THE WILDLIFE TOUR IS BACK! SHORTER...CHEAPER...WILDER THAN EVER JULY 26 & 29, 2020

Over the past 19 years, several hundred people have participated in the Wildlife Tour, LCPC's unique high country adventure. We took a break last summer, but we'll be back on the trail July 26-29, 2020. The trip is open to anyone going into ninth grade or older, including college students and adults. Families may sign up together. Participants should be in reasonably good physical condition.

The trip has been shortened by one day. The new 4-day schedule (Sunday afternoon through Wednesday late evening) gives us time for three full days of hiking along some of the most spectacular trails in North America.

Some people think the WT is only for hard core hikers. Not so. Because of its unique format and de-

sign, the WT is the perfect entré into big mountain hiking for the beginner. The WT is also a wonderful way to make new friends, strengthen old friendships, renew your spirit, and re-connect with God.

Throughout the trip we visit three different wilderness regions, yet we never have to carry a heavy pack, cook a meal outside or sleep in a tent. We hike every day for three days, but sleep in comfortable, air-conditioned hotel rooms (doubles). We carry our lunches on the trail but eat breakfasts and great dinners at local restaurants.

Each of the hiking days everyone gets to choose among three or four hikes, one or two of which are relatively short and of "moderate" difficulty, and one or two of which are fairly long and challenging. You're never forced to finish a hike, and you always have experienced people (and essential maps and equipment) with you. We also take time each day to worship, sing, and pray.

The fee for Wildlife Tour 2020 will be approximately \$280. It's "first come, first served" and we can only take about 28 people. The registration deadline is Monday, July 6. Watch for registration materials in the Church Office or the Student Center. You can also register online (after December 1) at: www.lcpc.net.

If you're a hiker or you'd like to become one if you love the Sierras or if you've always wanted to explore the spectacular back country — this trip is for you.


