WHEN MUSIC STUDENTS GO HOME EARLY

When COVID-19 hit Boston, every college campus in Boston shut down. With just days of notice, students were sent home to continue their classes online - uniquely challenging for dancers and musicians.

MINISTRY WITH BABY JONATHAN

When I (Marie) began working full-time after maternity leave, I brought Jonathan with me everywhere I went - to campus with students, and to my other meetings with staff.



Time is flying - Jonathan is 6 months old! He sits up on his own and loves to suck on broccoli. He even sleeps through the night — most nights!

I never imagined I would get to experience such a privilege: being with Jonathan while doing ministry I love all day! I even began to see my limitations as a gift - like needing breaks to feed Jonathan. I was flourishing in this new season of life.

The transition to online ministry was tough. Staring at a screen all day tires my eyes and Jonathan is much more antsy when I'm tied to a desk. Some days are stressful and hard, but other days I have had glimpses of the joy I felt before COVID-19 hit.

One proud "parenting in ministry" moment happened in February: Daniel and I taught the big picture story of the Old Testament to 20 music students, four hours long! We passed Jonathan back and forth as the other taught. (Jonathan took a nap sometime in there, too)

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SESSION REPORT

The March stated meeting of Session was canceled due to implementation of "Safer at Home" orders by the county and the state. However, several critical items needed to be approved by Session and after much technological preparation and blessings from the General Assembly and Presbytery of San Fernando, the Session held a called meeting on April 2 via Zoom video conferencing.

Items that were approved included the Maundy Thursday service with communion held via Facebook Live, and taping of worship services for Good Friday and Easter Sunday, as well as regular Sunday morning worship until "Safer at Home" orders have been lifted by local and state bodies.

Also discussed was the CARES Act which provides funds for the Payroll Protection Program for loans to small businesses. Because of the current pandemic, the CFC has had to close and Session authorized the Finance and Personnel committees to investigate and apply for one of these loans to assist in continuing to pay CFC personnel and possibly church employees in the event of financial shortfall. These loans are 100% forgiven by the government under certain conditions. The Finance and Personnel committees will work together and monitor the situation as Safer at Home orders continue.

Session will continue to hold regular stated meetings as planned via video conference as long as necessary. Church staff continues to work either at the church office observing social distancing, or at home. The staff, Session, and Board of Deacons are here for you if you should need any assistance. You can contact staff at the church office or you can contact me at: gray.sheri@gmail.com and I'll put you in contact with someone who can help. You can also go to the church website at: www.lcpc. net and click on "CV Together" which was formed to help people in the church family and wider community who are housebound or need special assistance.

How special to worship at home with the familiar faces of our pastors and praise band. There weren't many dry eyes when a video was shown on Easter with members and their families doing a montage of the bible reading. We all loved seeing the faces of people we miss so much!

Lee is doing an excellent **Bible study** of the Psalms every weekday from 9:00-9:30 AM on Facebook Live. If you haven't tuned in, you are missing out! WORSHIP SCHEDULE **FOR MAY**

SUNDAYS AT 9:00 AM

After Jesus shares the Last Supper with His disciples, He gives them His final instructions on how to live life after He leaves them. Understandably, they are worried and confused about His insistence that He must leave them. How can it be God's will for Jesus to die? How will they carry on His Kingdom work without Him? How will they face a cold and violent world?

The Greek word translated "abide" occurs 33 times in the Gospel of John. The word describes a deep, intimate connection. It describes how the Holy Spirit descends upon Jesus at his baptism. It also describes the relationship the Jesus wants with His followers. Jesus says that if we abide in Him and He abides in us, we'll bear much fruit (John 14:5). In this new sermon series, Abide, we'll explore John 14-17 and discover the joy of learning to abide in Jesus.
