Every Sunday we gather in the LCPC Courtyard from 6:30-7:20 PM for a joyful time of sociallydistanced, al fresco worship! Though we will probably change that plan if the indoor worship ban is lifted, our tentative plan is to offer Evensong Al Fresco Worship through September, 2020. What can you expect at these new services?

- Contemplative live music performed by extraordinary musicians (still no singing allowed)
- Bible readings and an inspiring message (same as the ones heard online)
- COVID-safe practices including social distancing and mask-wearing

Well-spaced seating is available throughout the Courtyard facing the stage and behind the upper floor railings.

Very few churches in California are offering public worship. Tell your friends who are stir-crazy from sheltering and hungry for Good News!

Remember, too: we still offer a Spirit-filled online worship option. We post a new service every Sunday morning at 9:00 AM. That service can be accessed at lcpc.net or on the LCPC YouTube channel. (Since the services are pre-recorded, you can access any service that has been posted anytime.)

SESSION REPORT

CFC FAITH

During the week of VBS, I filmed morning worship time in my office. One of the best parts of doing this was seeing the children of CFC playing in the courtyard and hearing them sing the VBS songs from their classrooms. I wish I knew exactly when we would be able to gather in the Fireside Room for large group chapels again. But until then, I am thankful for the chance to connect virtually and for each brief, six feet apart, masked conversation with the wonderful children of CFC. They continue to be bringers of joy during this trying season.

LEE'S LATEST

There's no doubt that we are in the middle of one the strangest times in recent memory. We are entering the sixth month of coronavirus sheltering, a divisive election season, an uncertain economy, and the prospect of home-schooling our children...I still can't remember how to divide fractions. The stress has accumulated to the breaking point, and I can't think of anything else to binge watch. I'm even contemplating watching musicals. Just kidding, it hasn't gotten that bad yet.

The Church is also experiencing a disruption. As we struggle to understand our mission during this sheltering in place, we are wrestling with the repercussions of generations of injustice. The slow decline in church attendance and engagement has accelerated during the Covid-19 pandemic. Barna research reports that during the pandemic, one in three practicing Christians has not connected with their church in any form (virtual or in person).

The Church is redefining and rediscovering its purpose, a process marked by prayer, reflection, and pain. I know this sounds



like a pessimistic article, but it's during these times of disruption that God gets our attention. This month, we're beginning a new sermon series called "Disruption: Challenging the Status Quo." In this sermon series, we'll be studying the Prophets, primarily Isaiah, Jeremiah, and Ezekiel. God used the Prophets to call His people back to true devotion, to challenge the disobedience and decadence of the day, and to promise hope in the midst of uncertainty. Once again, I believe God is calling us to greater faithfulness, and the prophets offer us a glimpse of what true devotion to God looks like: Holiness, Justice, Forgiveness, Concern for the poor and marginalized, Worship, and Obedience.

If you're dissatisfied with the consumer-driven, shallow, and partisan faith that is so prevalent in our culture, then the remedy is the message of the Prophets. But be warned: reading the Prophets will disrupt and challenge your status quo.

Contracts and Enrollment

You should have returned your contract by now if you plan to be with us starting August 17. If you are not ready to make that commitment, you can be placed on a VIP waiting list for returning students. If you did return your contract but your plans have changed, please remember we need a two-week notice of changes. So If you are not going to return on August 17, you need to let us know by August 3 so we can fill that spot with people on our wait list. I know this is distressing to those that may want to wait and see, or are not back at work yet. However for the health of CFC we need to have commitments and we need to be able to plan. We have tried to be as generous and flexible as possible and hope to be able to do that going forward.



The Center for Children will be closed on Friday, August 14 so that the staff can prepare for the school year. We will be setting up our Distance learning centers and preparing our preschool classes for new students.

We are pleased to announce the Center for Children's ...



This program will be offered at the Center for Children during the time that GUSD is using remote learning. This program will operate during the hours that GUSD determines to be the school day.

Students will be placed in learning cohorts and given supervision and help to stay focused on their remote learning as well as help with understanding their teacher's expectations. While this will not be a tutoring program, our dedicated staff will do everything in their power to help students have the best educational experience while facing remote learning. We will augment what GUSD is providing by adding outside/PE experiences, art opportunities, and other computer accessible learning opportunities.

Parents will need to work with CFC to communicate assignments and schedules. Parents will need to supply any computer, tablet, etc. that may be needed to access remote learning and a pair of headphones/ear pieces with microphone for that device. Please contact GUSD if you need help getting equipment.

We will continue to develop details of this program as we respond to GUSD's information. If at any point GUSD goes to partial on campus learning, we will continue to offer this program to work with GUSD updated plans.

Before and After School Care

We will continue to offer Before and After School Care for students outside the GUSD time frame. Here, students will get the social interaction and down time they need after a vigorous online school day. Children will be playing games, having art experiences, being outside and having fun.

You will be able to sign up for one program or both. Prices are yet to be determined as we need to wait to see the hours of the GUSD program.

We intend for the CFC to be back to regular

hours in total (7:00 AM - 6:00 PM) starting the week of August 17.

You will receive sign-up information about these programs soon.

We know that information is coming at you rapidly and that comfort levels differ and change with each news cycle. The Center for Children is trying to respond in a timely manner to new regulations and protocols. We appreciate your support and communication with us.

Infant, Toddler and Preschool

Infant, Toddler and Preschool programs will return back to the 7:00 AM to 6:00 PM schedule starting the week of August 17 as well. We will be offering our exceptional program meeting the academic and social needs of children while following safety protocols and procedures established by the Health Department.
