PEAK — **P**raise and **E**ducation for **A**dults and **K**ids — kicks off September 11! We hope you're planning to make PEAK a regular part of your week. But please take note, the Wednesday evening schedule will change.

Instead of starting dinner at 5:30 PM, we will start at 5:45 PM. Programs will still begin at 6:30 PM, but instead of ending at 8:00 PM, they will end at 7:30 PM. The Cathedral Choir will still rehearse from 7:30-9:00 p.m.

All the aspects of PEAK that so many people cherish will continue. We'll start with an excellent, nutritious, inexpensive meal in Koopmans Hall (again, at 5:45 PM). Then we'll enjoy fellowship groups and inspiring seminars for everyone in the family. That includes four different gatherings for children (all ending at 7:30 PM) as well as Abide Junior High. Abide will still end at 8:00 PM.

Why have these changes been made? Many LCPC leaders, our entire staff included, have been hearing from some PEAK participants that the evening feels long for them when it ends at 8:00 PM. That is especially true for many parents of young children, and one primary goal for PEAK is to help families with small children to feel welcomed and supported on Wednesday evenings. Those who lead PEAK events have expressed confidence that they can offer quality fellowship, teaching and prayer time within the one-hour format.

Adults will have two opportunities to grow as disciples. Andy Wilson will lead "Journey with Jesus" and Lee Cook will offer an in-depth study of the Letter to the Ephesians. Both groups will begin at 6:30 and end at 7:30 PM.

PASTOR'S LETTER

Dear friends, For many months now we've been talking about LCPC's *Vision* 2020 plan. In this exciting season, our overriding goal — our passion and desire as a church

family — is to produce an abundant harvest for the Lord. The Holy Spirit is challenging us to reach to new heights as we seek to grow God's kingdom.

Vision-casting is important and we've done a lot of that lately. We'll be talking more about the *Vision 2020* plan on September 8, Kick-Off Sunday, when we'll all worship together at 9:00 AM with our Praise Band and Cathedral Choir, celebrate Communion, and afterward enjoy a wonderful brunch provided free by Fellowship Ministry.

But the most important thing at this stage of our two-year journey (January 2019 through December 2020) is to put the right individuals and teams to work doing the right tasks.

We already have a small army of faithful servants hard at work. They're well trained and highly motivated, but they need help. The Kingdom needs the help of every member of Christ's body! That's why we're launching a new effort this month to mobilize and train new workers. Our goal for the next two months will be to inspire and activate people who sense the Spirit's call to service but who aren't being fully utilized. Or who maybe aren't doing the work that God created and called them to do.

How will we accomplish that goal? The LCPC leadership team is has organized a series of nine Mobilization Meetings between September 16 and October 5. The schedule and brief descriptions of those meetings are summarized below. I want to encourage everyone in the church family to prayerfully consider attending one or two of these gatherings.

What will happen at these meetings? The key

leaders from specific ministry areas will explain to attendees exactly how they can help. I will participate in each meeting. In some cases, other staff will also participate. Together we will outline the specific details of carefully-defined volunteer positions. We will also talk about the resources that will be available — including, in some cases, special training — that will help new recruits to be effective and successful.

Most of the positions we'll discuss will require only short-to-medium-term time commitments. Some involve tasks that can be accomplished in an afternoon or evening. Our goal will be to fill all of the positions so that every ministry area will have an abundance of workers.

The Lord told his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few" (Matthew 9:37). Jesus is still calling and sending all who love him. He's still using small, committed bands of workers to reap the harvest and change the world. We're not a mega-church, but we do have the capacity to influence many thousands of people. If each of us we will embrace our calling to be Kingdom-builders, we'll greatly magnify our impact on our fractured and Spirit-starved community.

So...would you please plan to attend one or two of the meetings outlined below? Listen to our ministry leaders as they describe the challenges and opportunities that are right in front of us. Ask the Spirit to show you how you can put to work the gifts he has blessed you with. Embrace your calling as a Kingdom-builder and resolve to do your very best in the work the Lord has for you.

May the Lord grant us His joy and peace as we serve.

Projects include: economy-level technology and décor upgrades to Fireside Room, the Chapel, Koopmans Hall and the Sanctuary; refurbishing stained glass windows in the Sanctuary, and renovating/making better use of the campus in the street side and breezeway areas.

Saturday, September 21, 9:00-10:15 AM PRAYER MINISTRY

LEE'S LATEST

It's tempting to romanticize the lives of the first followers of Jesus. The Holy Spirit moved with power, heroes like Peter and Paul walked the streets, and the Church was growing by leaps and bounds. And while all of that is certainly true, the early believers were surrounded by competing religious and political groups. They faced real persecution — political, social, and financial. The Church was a tiny, insignificant movement made up of all the wrong

kinds of people. Instead of the rich and powerful, they were mostly women and slaves, certainly not the kind of people that could change the world.

One of these small communities resided in Ephesus, a wealthy hub of commerce and political power. The dominant religion was devotion to Artemis, and her temple towered over the city. Here these early believers were trying to learn what it meant to be faithful to God — to live and work alongside people who were suspicious of their beliefs and practices.

Paul wants to Ephesian Christians to know

who they are in Christ. He wants to reshape their identity, not as the world defines them but based on the work of Jesus. This new identity leads to a whole new way of life.

Join me on September 11 as we begin a new class on Ephesians at PEAK. Bring your Bible and an open heart.


Kids Hope lasts a little more than an hour a week from September to May, and after doing it this year, I believe it is a unique opportunity to make a difference.

I spent the year with Angel, an 8-year-old boy who was referred because he was so shy he was falling behind. The first few months, Angel would sit next to me, eat his snack and watch the other kids play a wild game of tag with their mentors, Mary, Michelle and Andrew. It took several months before

he joined in — running, laughing, and having fun. After playing outside, we would all go in for one-on-one time.

Gradually, I saw Angel change. He figured out what he liked to do and did it. We got into a routine of playing a favorite game or educational activity, going to the library for a book to read, and in the last 15 minutes, doing homework. His shy smile turned into a mischievous grin as he consistently beat me in every game, and tricked me into reading the pages in the book that had more words on it. He was a very hard worker and finishing

My daughter Riley was working with a 4-yearold when the little girl suddenly stopped eating lunch and said, "Riley, I need to get something straight! Are fairies, unicoms and pirates real?" Riley answered her as honestly as she could at her level of understanding. She got a bit confused at Riley's answers because in her mind they all fit in the same category. But only one of these things is real

This story reminds me of how confusing child-hood can be for your kids. "Are my dreams real, is my imagination real, and are there things that go bump in the night?" Your kids are so exposed to images on many different screens and they all look real. Just look at the new Lion King movie. Can the animals really talk? So if this is confusing, let's think about some of the other things we ask children to understand or accept at an early age.

- "I've been home with you but now I need to go to this place called work and I need you to stay here and be happy."
- "Your Mom and I who used to be happy living together have now decided to live away from each other."
- "You used to be our one and only, but now you'll have a baby sister, won't that be great?"
- "Grandpa who came and took you to the park every Sunday isn't going to be able to do that anymore."

This isn't a guilt trip soliloquy, but rather a call to be tolerant with our little ones. Life happens and as adults we get to make the decisions about our families. people" to help you process that change. Children need time to process changes as well because most changes in their lives are not their choices, nor should they be.

So we prepare them as well as possible, we let them ask questions, and we give them the gift of time to be unhappy instead of happy on command. We understand that one day they may be okay with the change and the next day not so much. Read their body language not just verbal cues. Be in dialogue with them by using open-ended questions so they feel safe to tell you want is going on with them.

While all this takes time and patience, I have rarely meet a teenager who felt comfortable coming to a parent if they didn't get to practice that as a child.


